Comhbhrón: It was with great sadness that we heard of the passing of Mr. John Browne, a long- time friend and supporter of Bennekerry N.S. John served as Principal in our school from 1962-1989, at which time he left to take up his duties as a T.D. representing the Carlow/Kilkenny constituency. He was a great servant to the school and the community and worked tirelessly to improve conditions for those living in the locality. His influence on the lives of those who attended Bennekerry N.S. during his tenure was immense and he will be remembered for his enthusiasm, energy and good humour. Polasaithe na Scoile: Our Child Safeguarding Statement and Risk Assessment have been updated with a few minor adjustments. Staff, parent representatives and pupils were asked for their contributions and the Board of Management completed the required annual review checklist at their meeting on 26th March. The Notification regarding this review has been given to the PA, the patron and all school personnel and it has also been posted on the website. The updated version of the Child Safeguarding Statement and Risk Assessment have also been posted and a hard copy is on display in the front hallway of the school. If anything comes to your attention at any point which you feel should be added to the Risk Assessment, please contact the school. A "Protected Disclosures in the Workplace Policy" was also ratified by the BOM at a meeting on 4th April. This too has been posted to the website.

SPHE: All classes are coming to the end of the designated time-period for completing the Stay Safe Programme or the more sensitive section of the RSE programme, whichever applies to the particular class as explained in our letter in January. On 3rd and 4th April the pupils in 4th-6th classes were visited by Ger Brick who gave enlightening talks on Internet Safety and Cyber-Bullying. Pupils were informed about the importance of respectful communication, privacy settings and passwords and the dangers of passing on personal information among other things. On the evening of 4th April Ger gave a talk for parents which included information on Parental Controls, what to watch for in the case of Cyber-Bullying and the importance of controlling gaming time and content. Feedback from those who were present was very positive. Crime Prevention Office, Garda Peter McConnon was also present and he highlighted the dangers associated with misuse of Information Technology and acknowledged that it is vital that parents are aware of how their children are engaging with on-line apps and games.

Treodóireacht: Our school grounds were recently mapped by Orienteering Ireland. This project was funded by the Board of Management. Included with the mapping is software which enables us to set up different orienteering courses in the grounds. The pupils must follow the maps to find a series of markers and controls. Ms. Lyttleton has completed training in this area and is generously sharing her skills with the rest of the staff. Her class have already used the maps and enjoyed the experience greatly. We look forward to using the materials with all our classes in the future as we further the children's education in a fun and active manner.

Bratach Scoile Gníomhaí: As part of the Active Schools initiative, the Active School Committee gathered data on all the different sporting activities that our pupils are involved in in the local area. Ms. Tomlinson then graphed the results and they are on display in the front hall. Our hope is that it may encourage less active pupils to take note of the variety of activities which are available and they may perhaps take up an active past-time. 4th-6th class were privileged to have a visit from Eric O'Donovan, newly crowned Irish Champion Professional boxer this week. Along with showing off his prized belts, Eric spoke to the pupils about the importance of being active, eating healthily, taking pride in yourself, making good choices, celebrating success without putting others down and maintaining general well-being. He is an extraordinary young man and it was wonderful to hear his message of positivity.

Reiligiún: Pupils from 3rd-5th class will receive the Sacrament of Penance on April 11th. 6th Class will be on a retreat in Mount St. Anne's that day as part of their preparation for Confirmation. They will have confessions during the Ceremony of Light which takes place on 30th April in St. Mary's Church Bennekerry at 8pm.

Scrúduithe Éisteachta agus Físe: Hearing and Vision tests for the Junior Infant classes will take place in the school hall on 8th and 9th May.

Scoileanna Glasa: This academic year and next we will be working on our theme of Global Citizenship, Litter and Waste. Earlier in the year children from 2nd to 6th class were given the opportunity to apply to become a member of our Green Schools Committee. We had a terrific response and the following children were selected as members; Rebecca O Reilly and Neil Connolly-Devoy (2nd Class), Milly Rice and Jim Foley (3rd Class), Lily O' Connor and Michaela Deenadayalan (4th Class), Dylan Farrell and Chloe Ryan (5th Class) and Elliot Hutchinson and Katie Bowe (6th Class). All senior classes are partaking in a weekly litter duty rota in the school grounds and each class currently composts fruit peelings and pencil shavings daily. We also have recycling bins for paper and card in every classroom. We encourage all children to bring a reusable water bottle to school and to work with us in reducing single use plastics in our school. We ask you as parents to ensure that your child has a reusable bottle for school each day. We would appreciate your support, as it is one of our targets to significantly reduce the amount of single use plastics in school and single use water bottles are unfortunately still quite prevalent. Fifth and sixth class members of the Green Schools Committee recently worked together to write a letter to the Parents Association. They requested that reusable plastic cups and mugs would be purchased for use at school celebrations such as Communion and Confirmation. This would eliminate the need to buy single use coffee cups and plastic cups. The Parents Association kindly agreed to our request and we see this as a step in the right direction for our school. We are delighted to have our Parents Association on board and thank them for their support. Please remember that you can send your used batteries into school and when we collect enough we will arrange to have them recycled by WEE.

We have also invited Mura Tierney from Goal to deliver a drama-based workshop to our 4th classes which will highlight the plight of the people in Ethiopia and South Sudan. This will take place on 28th May.

Turasanna Scoile: Our school tours are all booked and will take place between Monday 11th and Friday 21st June. Further details will be given by class teachers closer to the time.

Éide Scoile: While most pupils are adhering well to our school uniform, there are some issues with tracksuit bottoms. Remember that pupils should be wearing **plain navy tracksuit bottoms**, no large logos or stripes and leggings are not permitted. The Easter holidays may be a good opportunity to purchase new tracksuits if needs be.

Hospice Fundraiser: Co. Carlow Hospice is launching its annual Sunflower Competition for Primary Schools. Each child may purchase a packet of sunflower seeds from their teacher for 50 cent. They are to be planted and cared for over the summer months and there will be prizes for the tallest sunflowers in September. If your child wishes to take part, he/she should bring the money to his/her teacher on or before Fri. 3rd May. The seeds will then be ordered and distributed. All funds raised will go to Co. Carlow Hospice.

Ranganna Ealaíne: A new set of 7 art classes will begin after Easter and will end on June 19th. These classes take place from 2-3pm for the Infant classes and 3-4pm for 1st Class upwards every Wednesday afternoon in Seomra 3. Growth Mindsets: By now our pupils should be well aware of the possibility of "growing your brain" and are familiar with growth mindset ideals. Should you wish to refresh yourselves on the prompts that the pupils were given each week, they are featured on our website. To summarise the content of our lessons we have booked a performance for the pupils entitled "NED's Mindset Mission!" Through this performance the students will learn

- The Power of Yet If you're not good at something, it just means you're not good at it yet
- How to **spark courage** in others
- How to keep learning and growing, even when they think they already know something

NED's Mindset Mission is an interactive, 45-minute all-school performance which uses storytelling, puppetry, illusions and yoyo tricks to take the students on an entertaining journey with the character NED. He follows clues, meets memorable characters and learns valuable lessons.

Generally, there would be a considerable charge for this performance, but the group have agreed to put it on for free. Instead, on the day of the show, the performer will bring a selection of NED messaged items – primarily yo-yo's like the ones used during the performance. These will be available for families to purchase for 5-10 school days following the performance which will take place on 6th June. There is no pressure on any family to buy as there is no minimum sale requirement; what we collect is what is accepted as payment for the show.

Bags2School: Thanks to everyone who contributed to our collection of unwanted clothing and especially to the parents who made themselves available to take in the bags at the appointed times. It has been suggested that many people may have more time for a clear-out over the Easter holidays and therefore it has been decided to have additional collection dates as follows.
