St. Patrick's Day is almost upon us and while I thought about leaving our newsletter until Easter, the term has been busy as always and if I leave it any longer, there simply won't be room to include everything!!

SSE: The planned activities which were outlined in our letter in January were implemented over the past three months and proved to be very worthwhile. Our Gratitude Tree, which reminded us of the positives in our lives has only recently been taken down while our Growth Mindsets encouraged our pupils to always do their best and to believe that, for each of them, there are endless possibilities. We focussed on healthy eating and Mrs. Brennan's 1st class and Ms. Griffin's 4th class were the winners of our Junior and Senior Fruit and Vegetable Class Tracker competitions. This has been a very valuable initiative and the pupils are certainly more aware of why it is important to eat healthily. With this in mind, we remind you of our Healthy Eating Policy which allows treats only on Fridays and even then, the treat should be simply a small bar. Sweets are not allowed, and sharing is not permitted as the parents/guardians of each child should be able to monitor what his/her child has eaten in school. Move to Music Mondays and Fun Day Fridays were big hits with our younger pupils while many classes took on the 10 at 10 challenge and the 1st classes started a new initiative which they called 2 at 2. At 2pm each day, weather permitting, they completed two rounds of our walking track before returning to class feeling fully refreshed and ready for further learning. The information evening for parents on the Stay Safe programme was well attended and workshops for 5th and 6th classes on the sensitive areas of the RSE programme were also well received. Stay Safe and RSE are being taught in the designated classrooms at present in line with our revised SPHE School Plan.

Rialacha na Scoile: The recent inquest into the death of a young student in UL following a "domino effect" fall on a staircase served as a stark reminder of the importance of keeping what may seem to be relatively insignifcant rules. Pupils are constantly being reminded to walk on footpaths, hold the rail on the stairs, not to bunch together when going through narrow entrances, walk on the walking track, not to run on the courts at morning assembly time etc. but some continue to do so despite these repeated cautions. Behaviour Report Cards may be given so that pupils will take these rules more seriously, as we want to ensure that our school environment is as safe as possible and the chances of accidents happening are reduced. Remember, these cards are simply a communication between the school and home and an opportunity for you to talk to your child about his/her behaviour, how it might be improved and why it is important to do so. If you have further queries in relation to this matter, please read Appendix 1 of our Code of Behaviour which is available on our website. If you have difficulty accessing it, please ask at the office for a hard copy. Your co-operation in these matters is vital if our pupils are to be allowed to feel safe, happy and be provided with the best opportunities for learning so as to reach their full potential.

Comhbhrón: The entire school community was shocked and saddened to learn of the death of Brendan Lennon, loving husband of staff member Zelma and devoted father of our past pupils Sinéad and Cadi. The pupils and staff gathered in the hall for a special prayer service to pray for the repose of his soul, and members of staff and the Students' Council represented the school at the funeral which took place on 14th February. Brendan will be remembered among his friends and acquaintances for his kindness, his commitment to his job and his family along with his quick wit and understated humour. All pupils in the school partook in a prayer service to mark Catholic Schools Week in January and the theme for the week was "Celebrating the Work of Our Local Catholic School". Ash Wednesday was also marked with a ceremony in St. Mary's Church and Trócaire boxes were distributed for use in the homes during Lent.

Ceardlann na Sábháilteachta Idirlín: A reminder once again that Internet Safety workshops will be delivered to 4th-6th classes on 3rd and 4th April and an information evening for parents will take place in the school at 7pm on Thursday 4th April at 7pm. It is strongly hoped that at least one parent from each family will be present as this is such an important issue for our young people. An Garda Síochána will be represented on the night as they take their role in community policing very seriously and welcome this opportunity to engage with the school community. We also ask that all parents should check any "fitbits" or smart watches which your child may be wearing. If it is capable of taking photographs or sending or receiving messages, it should not be brought to school as, in line with our code of behaviour, such electronic devices are banned. This measure was brought in with the strong support of parents based on the results of a survey carried out last year.

Finally, I wish to remind you that the school will be closed from 14th- 20th March while our Easter holidays will begin on Friday 12th April at 12 noon (11:40am for Infants and their siblings).
